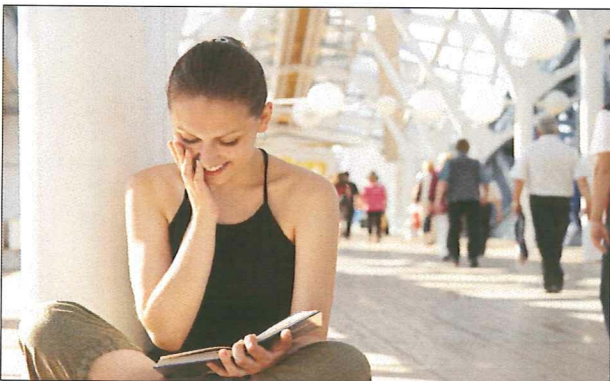

Our Purpose:

North Staffs Community Chaplaincy:

NSCC is part of the work of the Saltbox and offers:

- a service providing supported accommodation to people with a history of offending who might otherwise be homeless
- a service of individually tailored support within a framework of equal opportunities, anti-discrimination and respect
- a service which is dedicated to assisting with education, training and employment opportunities as part of our skills programme
- a place to safely deal with life events whilst looking positively towards the future
- a service which aims to reduce the impact of homelessness and re-offending
- reconciling family relationships whilst re-integrating into community life

Can we help:

- Community Chaplaincy houses vulnerable adults over the age of 25 who need support to maintain independent living
- prospective clients have served a prison sentence and have been released during the last two years
- referrals can be accepted from the prison before release and other partner organisations such as the probation service
- a comprehensive needs and risk assessment is carried out prior to acceptance into our service
- on the day of release from prison, we will collect you from the gate and assist you with settling into your home
